# **Curators' Vision**

**Daniella Celine Williams**, a graduate of the University of the Arts London and Goldsmiths College, brings a deep, lifelong exploration of ancient belief systems, sacred geometry, and humanity's connection to unseen realms to this extraordinary event. Her studies in astro-archaeology and ancient healing techniques profoundly shape her artistic and curatorial approach, emphasising the intricate connections between humanity, nature, and the cosmos.

"Art has the unique power to transcend boundaries and transform awareness into purpose," says Daniella. "Through this event, I aim to honour the Amazon's sacred beauty while inspiring meaningful action to preserve it."

**Giulietta Bateman**, a producer and curator with an academic background in Ancient Cultures, Anthropology, and Sociology from Stellenbosch University, combines her expertise in history and the arts with a deep personal connection to nature. Inspired by her early fascination with fossils and archaeology, as well as her grandfather's pioneering work as Head of the Cape Archaeological Society, Giulietta brings a unique perspective to her curatorial approach.

"Our goal is to use art to illustrate the interconnectedness between nature and humanity," adds Giulietta. "This event encourages a deeper understanding of the Amazon's critical role in sustaining life on Earth."

Curatorially, the event celebrates the sacredness of nature, its evolving manifestations through time, and the unparalleled beauty and importance of the Amazon Rainforest. The curators have

masterfully united art, historical artefacts, photography, music, and performance into a stunning and immersive multi-sensory cultural experience.

The items and artworks showcased span a vast expanse of time – from partially mineralised trees and dinosaur fossils to outstanding contemporary pieces created exclusively for the event by leading London-based and international artists. Each piece reflects the event's central themes, offering audiences a profound journey through the sacred connection between humanity and the natural world.
